The “family” of Marble Retreat not only grows via those who partake of our ministry services, but also through those we meet while travelling and promoting the ministry and our wonderful volunteers. Marble Retreat has a long and wonderful history of welcoming interns, providing them with a rich and expansive in vivo learning experience of how to best help the church leaders and couples who arrive desperately seeking transformation and restoration of hope. Training and equipping people for ministry via some kind of internship is not only biblically-based, it is a very sound and solid method of expanding this kingdom work throughout the world! One can see this kind of experience occurring even in the Lord’s selecting his apostles to accompany him on his ministry journeys, gaining field experience. Moreover, it is pretty clear that Timothy functioned as an intern to Paul as he, Timothy, “learned the ropes” of ministry.

Typically, we welcome interns during our summer season and, on average, we have about 3-5 per season. They initially act as observers and do so only during the group counseling sessions. Prior to even attending one of our group dates, we secure consent from all attendees, providing them with a brief biography of each intern which includes their vocational/ministry goals. We all gather during the group sessions and provide debriefing/supervision of their counseling impressions and experiences subsequent to each group session. As this experience in the group session progresses, the interns are inevitably “captured” by the other group members and become a helping partner and member of the group. They wonderfully become Marble Retreat Family!

We are quite proud of this now well established tradition of welcoming interns at Marble Retreat and hope to continue this practice in the years ahead!

I often tell the people who come here that it is a special place. God shows up and does amazing things with people’s hearts. We wrestle and work to find truth in the hearts of the people in the lodge. We work to find truth in the word of God. And we work to find truth in each other. It is an amazing journey.

One morning before group started, I heard in my mind, “Psalm 46.” I had been wrestling with a personal challenge and it seemed funny to have Psalm 46 keep popping up in my consciousness. Finally, after my second cup of coffee, I pulled out my Bible and read Psalm 46, which begins ***“God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.”*** And wouldn’t you know it, verse 10 says, ***“Be still and know that I am God.”*** Well, of course, I then realized that we had been mentioning Psalm 46 in group throughout the days. The whole Psalm is a reintroduction to who our God really is.
