

“unlovable” part of ourselves, we reject one of the main aspects of love – acceptance. We all need to be loved and allow ourselves to be loved in our brokenness. Through Christ we are fully acceptable in God’s eyes. He loves us fully, even with our brokenness. One of our goals at Marble Retreat is to provide a place where a child of God can experience being loved and accepted in brokenness.
